

## A Time of Reflection & Celebration 58th UOVBA Annual Messengers Meeting





#### A REVIEW OF CELEBRATION

A reflection and celebration of our 58th annual messengers meeting of the upper Ohio Valley Baptist Association was held on October 21st at Emmanuel Baptist Church in St. Clairsville, Ohio. What a celebration it was! We had 43 messengers show up from our churches across the association in addition to several guests from the state office and others that came to speak.

The meeting opened up with a great prayer and time of reflection of "In the beginning God" with our scripture being Genesis 1:1 given by Pastor Bruce Taylor who encouraged everyone to be connected in prayer.



Early business included a financial report from treasurer Larry Bayle that highlighted annual receipts in excess of the association's \$100,000 spending plan. God's faithful provision prompted messengers to adopt another faith-based spending plan for 2019 of over \$131,000. To God be the glory!

We also had our missions development report from Dave Barrick. He shared highlights of the association's mission trip to Kentucky Motor Speedway in July, such as campground ministry, children's ministry and also how they escorted people back and forth from the racetrack. Dave also shared how they had the opportunity to pray with several individuals at the racetrack. In 2019 we will be going back to Kentucky Motor Speedway and continuing with celebrating and doing this mission trip. We want to encourage everyone to be on the lookout for the information as it gets closer to sign up for the mission trip to Kentucky Motor Speedway next July.

Dave then shared about mission opportunities locally. One mission opportunity is the Hillbilly 100 which is down in Tyler County, West Virginia during the Labor Day Weekend. One event that takes place is a kayak race that is roughly 6 miles long. Groups were able to handout tracks to the individuals who were racing and be there to help with loading the Kayaks into the water while getting the chance to know the individuals racing. This presented a great opportunity to share the gospel Jesus Christ with them.

After the kayak race, different groups went to the campgrounds around Tyler County Speedway doing Camper Ministry. They went camper to camper knocking on doors sharing with them information about the races that are coming up. In addition, they asked if there were any prayer needs that the campers had along with sharing

a gospel track with them too.

On the evening of the Hillbilly 100, groups were stationed at the front gate of the racetrack and in the areas of the pit outside the grandstands to share tracks and race information. Those individuals had the opportunity to share the race history with people that were coming through and to share the gospel and pray with people. We had the opportunity to as see several individuals open up to have prayer. This was a great ministry to take part in and we want to encourage everyone to think about this for next year.



Dave then shared about a day of faith and encouraged individuals to consider taking a day to volunteer their time to work with Faith Community Church as they start their building project. Anyone who is interested in finding out more information on what they can do to help out Faith Community Church please contact Ray and Pete Carney to see about volunteering your time and or resources to help out. A time then came for individuals who are missionaries going on mission trips throughout this next year to come up and share what mission opportunity they have and where they were going. We also had a special guest, an unnamed missionary, share with us about how God has guided his family to go and share the gospel with an unreached people group in a country that is closed. God was moving during this time and as we gathered to pray everyone was encouraged to lay hands on those individuals. The isles were flooded with everyone coming up for that special time of prayer.





After that time of prayer, Danny Rumple, from the West Virginia convention Southern Baptist, share with us some information about the upcoming annual meeting for the West Virginia Convention of Southern Baptists which will be held in Parkersburg West Virginia. He also spoke about the importance of church planting and gave some updates from around the state.

Danny also prayed over Bobby Thomas and Gary Eller as these two pastors have been in prayer about church planting. Gary Eller recently panted Fairpoint Community Church and Bobby Thomas is considering a viable church plant in the future. This is something that we all need to be involved with. Pray that God opens the opportunity throughout our association for our churches to plant healthy churches in local communities so they can be reached for the gospel of Jesus Christ.



A Special moment came during the 58th Annual Messengers Meeting, when a video tribute remember Larry Holtz was shown. After the video Director of Missions Ed Goodman presented Doris Holts with a special award celebrating the faithful years of service Larry had over the years across the association. The following words are from Doris Holtz as she shared with us that morning.

"I just want to say thank you, Larry would have been very please this. It is hard to lose a husband. But I know that he is with Jesus and that the life Larry lived before he come to know the Lord, he wouldn't have been with Jesus. So what God did was a miracle when he saved Larry."

"And I knew very shortly after he was saved that Larry would be called into the ministry. And he died wanting to still serve God."

"His greatest pleasure in life was to preach. The weeks he had to spend with Chester was his last week and he was very sad to have to call and say that he wouldn't be able to come up there because he was sick."

"In the first week he spent in Cleveland, in the ICU unit, he was so highly upset that he saw people lose family members across the hall and he couldn't go and have prayer with them. So I draw comfort when I think about how lonely I am or how I would like to have my handyman back, I think about how upset he would be If he had not have gotten well enough to minister again."

"And I knew very shortly after he was saved that Larry would be called into the ministry. And he died wanting to still serve God."

"I can't feel sorry for myself when I think that he is so much better off than he would be if he was still living today."

"And when they told us they didn't know if he should pull through this what his life would be like, he probably would be back on oxygen. The possibilities would have been that maybe he would not have been able to go back and preach and that would have been harder for him than anything."






