

Phase 1 Invite Your DOM to Preach

- Sunday Morning
- Target Time Frame: 1-3 months ahead of any church revitalization effort.

Phase 2 Private Pastoral Consultation

- Confidential
- BATCH & SWOT Analysis
- Determine where you want to go and how to get there.


Phase 3 Strategic Planning with Key Leaders

- Address only one area at first.
- STEP Analysis & SWOT Analysis
- Determine key metrics.
- Develop effective strategies, systems, and structures for ministries.

Phase 4 Implementation & Evaluation

- Put people and procedures in place.
- Follow up with leaders and volunteers.
- SWOT Analysis & Key Metrics Review
- Make necessary adjustments.

A DEEPER LOOK AT THE PROCESS

PHASE 2 PRIVATE PASTORAL CONSULTATIONS

Once the church understands that their association exists to serve, supply, and strengthen the local church, the pastor will meet with the DOM to examine the church's mission, vision, and strategic plans. This will afford the pastor great liberty to communicate openly in a private setting. Several tools will be used to develop a clear picture of where the church stands and where the church is going, such as the Biblical Assessment of Total Church Health (BATCH) and the Church Leaders Evaluation and Revitalization (CLEAR) Process. Phase 2 will likely involve several meetings between the DOM and the pastor as they prayerfully partner together to clarify the church's mission, values, strategy, vision, plans, and goals.

During a sermon, a pastor asked a reflective question to the congregation, "And what is a saint?"

A little boy looked up at the stained glass windows of the apostles and blurted out, "People who let the light shine through!"

There is a great sense of joy at the light I see shining through our churches. FBC Chester is calling a new pastor after twenty months of prayer and patience. Faith Community Church is constructing a new campus in North Wheeling to worship the Lord and serve the community that they love so dearly. Indian Creek Christian School is quickly approaching the completion of its first full year of classes. Immanuel Baptist Church celebrated over \$81,000 in missions giving during 2018. Open Door Baptist Church set a new church record with over \$6,500 given to the Lottie Moon Christmas Offering. Four churches are preparing to host mission teams from the Pines Baptist Association in Michigan at the end of March. The light of the Gospel is bright in our association!

Our pastors are leading well, too. Several of them gather each month in our newly-launched cluster ministry to share fellowship, ideas, and encouragement with one another. One pastor has begun the All In consultation phase. Another pastor has launched a leadership development ministry that is thriving, with one brother answering God's call into another area of ministry! Indeed, the Son of God is shining His light through the pastors of the Upper Ohio Valley.

Yet these redemptive rays of Gospel hope are conspicuously missing from the world around us. Everywhere we look, darkness seemingly prevails. The political chaos in Washington tragically underscores the selfishness of leaders who prioritize power above people and showmanship above service. 


