

According to the U.S. Census Bureau, there are at least 151,671 different last names and 5,163 different first names commonly used in the United States. Worldwide, there are roughly 1.2 million unique first names, with about 650,000 of these representing roughly 90% of the population. Through natural language processing and the scratching of similar names with different spellings (e.g., Mark, Marc, Marck, etc.), that figure drops to about 520,000. It seems that certain names can be written in many different ways.

In a similar sense, the Resurrection of Christ is conveyed in multiple ways. When it comes to the Messiah overcoming death, a variety of words can capture its essence.

"Christ grose"

"The Lord is risen."

"He rose from the grave."

"Jesus is alive."

"Our Savior is resurrected."

However you say it, take some time during this glorious season to ponder the reality that Jesus Christ is King over death, hell, and the grave. Feel free to laugh in the face of death and boast in the Lord. He is still on eternity's throne.

The Danger is Real Dr. Brady Stephens

I wish I could tell you that it's just news hype. That it's one of those things being over dramatized to sell newspapers or television advertising space. Or that it's something that has always been this way and we are just hearing more about it now. I even wish I could tell you that this whole thing is being blown out of proportion by the anti-gun lobby. I wish I could honestly write off the facts some way and things were like they used to be but these are all just wishes. Reality tells us things have changed. Our churches are not as safe as they once were. Not even close.



The nation was shocked into the new reality November 7th, 2017 when a man armed with an AR-15 style rifle went into First Baptist Church in the small community of Sutherland Springs, Texas and murdered 26 people, wounding another 20. It was the deadliest shooting in an American place of worship in modern history. And while this attack sits at the top of the list in terms of devastation, it is certainly a long list.

Dr. Carl Chinn has been a student of violence on faith based properties for many years. A study of the statistics on his website, www.carlchinn.com, shows us just how commonplace attacks on churches have become.

2017 was the most violent year in modern history for faith based properties. In that year alone we experienced 261 Deadly Force Incidents (DFI's) resulting in 118 deaths. Last year there were 246 DFI's. The year before there were 248.

This flood of violence on faith based properties started to climb steadily about 12 years ago. In the years prior to that the nation was seeing less than 10 DFI's per year. The increase is stunning. From less than 10 per year to a place where anything in the 250 range seems normal in a dozen years!



There are several theories as to what caused this and what must be done to reverse this trend. Maybe we will look at that in another article. But we can make changes in our local church practices that will increase our safety right away. Let's start this week and let's start with what we have.

Check the exterior doors of your church building. Make sure all locks are in good working order and the church can be "locked down" if you know there is someone headed in to do harm. Make sure classroom doors can be effectively locked from the inside in case you have to lock down in there.

Find out if your local 911 center can receive text messages. You may need to send a text if you are hiding from a gunman and need to be quiet. And if too many cell phones are calling this in at once the towers will sometimes overload and not allow a call through. But even if a call doesn't get through sometimes a text message will. Not all 911 centers are equipped to receive texts. Find out if yours is.


- 1. A 1 hour daily Live call-in Show Hosted by Pastor Nate Freeman and Youth Pastor/ Worship Leader Trey Freeman


Faith Community Church
